In June of 2019, Pastor Danny's dream of a free community meal became a reality. This mission, dubbed 'The Table' welcomed community members on the 1st and 3rd Fridays of the month. No questions asked or ID required, if you attended, we knew there was a need, be it financial or otherwise. Although we never asked for donations, nor had a donation bin in view, many folks were kind enough to hand cash towards their meals. At its conception, we met in the social hall, served meals to attendees, had dessert, joined together for a few songs and a discussion time on a scripture or thought.

In 2020, COVID shut down everything. The 'crew', however, realized the need was greater than ever! We were shut down for roughly three months, until we transitioned our sit down meal to a drive-thru meal. We would prepare meals and place them in to-go containers, ask folks to drive around the building to the kitchen door, we'd go out and greet them, find out how many they needed, and bring them to their vehicle. Pastor Sam took it a step further and took a pen and paper out and asked for prayer concerns! We had a connection with folks like no other. We learned about their health issues, family needs, and things that were weighing heavy on their hearts. We became a family. We missed folks when we didn't see them. We had folks who didn't take for themselves, but picked up for neighbors. We had teachers trying to struggle through virtual school who just didn't have the capacity to make a meal after a long week of difficult technology.

We saw a huge increase in our numbers! Folks had a need. There was also something about coming through the drive-thru that had enough personalization, yet enough anonymity. We discussed bringing it back inside, but decided this was best. Our numbers skyrocketed! At the height, we were serving over 100 meals on a fairly regular basis!

After much prayer and conversation, it has been decided that the ministry we call The Table is no longer able to meet the goals that it was created under. This ministry has been beneficial for both the recipients and the volunteers, but over-head is too costly, and we do not have the volunteers needed to make it a viable mission. We're immensely thankful for the folks from St. Leos and Paynes Chapel UMC who assisted us with many meals throughout the years, as well as Pastors Danny, Sam, and Katy for their genuine dedication to this ministry. We also owe a HUGE THANK YOU to Norma Coe who spent countless hours meal planning, prepping, canning, and cooking for this ministry throughout the years. Please be in prayer for those who this ministry has blessed, as we continue to focus on meeting the needs of the community.

7:00 PM @ BHPC




Friday before Easter. Most solem day of the church year. Observes the day Jesus was crucified. Observed by praying the stations of Stations of the Cross.




Hallelujah Christ has risen! This day we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. Sing hallelujahs and celebrate with great joy.

Read through the New Testament in 5 days a week, 5 minutes a day.

5 MINUTES A DAY

If you're not used to reading the Bible daily, start with this easy-to-use tool to read a chapter of the New Testament in 5 minutes a day. This reading plan will take you through all 260 chapters of the New Testament, one chapter per day. The Gospels are read through the year to weave in the story of Christ all year long.

5 DAYS A WEEK

Determine a time and location to spend 5 minutes a day for 5 days a week. It is best to have a consistent time and quiet place where you can regularly meet with the Lord.

5 WAYS TO DIG DEEPER

Pause in your reading to dig into the Bible. Below are 5 different ways to dig deeper each day. These exercises will encourage meditation. Try a single idea for a week to find what works best for you. Remember to keep a pen and paper ready to capture God's insights.

- 1. Underline or highlight keywords or phrases in the Bible passage. Use a pen or highlighter to mark discoveries from the text.
- 2. Put it in your own words. Read the passage or verse slowly, then rewrite each phrase or sentence using your own words.
- 3. Ask and answer questions. Questions unlock discoveries and meanings. Ask questions about the passage using these words: who, what, why, when, where, or how. Jot down your answers to these questions.
- 4. Capture the big idea. God's Word communicates big ideas. Periodically ask: What's the big idea in this sentence, paragraph, or chapter?
- 5. Personalize the meaning. Respond as God speaks to you through the Scriptures. Ask: how could my life be different today as I respond to what I'm reading?










A Gift from God
